
INTRODUCTION




I Students Feedback and Action taken report




- Students suggested the need for job oriented courses, training for facing interviews during campus selection. They also requested to provide career guidance and expert talks by industrialists.

 Employability and placement opportunities.














































Il Teachers' Feedback
























































Result of the feedback analysis


- The value 4.65 implicit that the contents of the course have been presented from simple to complex form
