
## STUDENT'S FEEDBACK






From the below diagram, we infer that


- Out of 100% only 2% of the respondent has average opinion that the syllabus of their programme was career oriented.
- Students suggested that recent course can be implemented in the curriculum which will benefit in upcoming area of job opportunities.
- More than 90% students rated curriculum has inclusion of other course.
- Only 5% of the respondents have rated poor and average for overall rating of the programme on teaching and learning experience.
- 87% students said that the curriculum is a good mix of theory and practical.
- 88% students stated that the books prescribed/listed as reference materials are very good updated, relevant and appropriate.
















































#### **ACADEMIC YEAR 2021-2022**


Collecting feedback from the teachers is most essential for the success of every institution. All these feedbacks were analyzed by using a five-point rating scale. The maximum score is five and the minimum score is one, where 5 indicates Excellent, 4 means very good, 3 indicates good, 2 indicates average and 1 indicates poor. The faculty opinion about the curriculum development mentioned below. The teacher's feedback was collected annually from various department faculties of Tamilnadu Physical Education and Sports University about the curriculum. The feedback was analyzed using statistical tools towards the improvements in the quality of course design for the academic year 2021-2022. Around 130 feedback forms collected for consideration to the development of curriculum. The results are listed below.





















































## Feedback analysis report


The feedback taken from teachers about the present syllabus and curriculum of the course reveals the following fact

- The 65% of the faculties have the opinion that the present contents of the course should increase from simple to complex form.
- Most of the respondent has the opinion that the curriculum has to focus on skill development oriented programmes.
- Only 61% of the faculties use the laboratory facilities during delivering the course for the students.
- The faculties have the opinion that the staff who handling the subjects should involved in curriculum framing.
- The percentage of alumni representatives involved in curriculum revision would increase.

## ALUMNI FEEDBACK REPORT

Analysis of the alumni feedback for the year 2021-2022 revealed the following.

- Research activities must be strengthened by conducting conference, seminar, workshop etc.
- Research quality may be enhanced by collaborative research with other institutions in India.
- Apart from regular teaching, social awareness and human values to be imparted to students.
- Majority of them pointed to focus more on research based teaching, learning strategies to expose the students the latest development in research.
- Some of the faculties pointed that sufficient number of relevant reading materials and eresources are not available in the University Library to deliver the course.
- Majority of respondents have the opinion that the student and alumni representatives are most important persons taken into account during curriculum revision.
- The career-oriented syllabus was quite helpful for them to find out an employment.
