Dr. Shahin Ahmed, Director, IQAC presented the Action Taken Report on the minutes of the previous meeting and stated the pending issues.

07	A webinar on National Education Policy 2020 was conducted in the first week of December 14 th 2021.
08	An incubation center has been set up and it has been approved in the Academic Council Meeting..
09	Efforts are being taken by Dr. Rajesh Kumar to obtain Corporate Social Responsibility Funding for the purchase of exclusive cycles or developing cycles for the use of the differently abled athletes
10	Tailoring Machines have been purchased to conduct course on designing and stitching sports wear to develop entrepreneurship skills and to create work opportunity for the students.
P 11	A Digital Language Laboratory is established at this university at a cost of Rs.14.52 lakhs to improve the students proficiency in communication. The objective is to equip the students with good communication skills, involving them to actively participate in the language learning process, to prepare them for interviews, and to train them in the art of conversation and discussion and to update themselves in the latest technological development.
12	Efforts are being initiated to Establish High Performance Centre for sports with scientific supporting collaboration with Sports Associations of Tamil Nadu and Sports Development Authority of Tamil Nadu. This pathway begins with participation and extend through talent identification, talent development into elite development, right through to world-class athlete. This

	<p>center would provide scientific support to budding and upcoming sports persons and International players of University, State and National campers. It will have facilities for scientific assessment, conditioning and training and Medical facilities. The proposed disciplines are Badminton, Table Tennis, Canoeing and Kayaking, Cycling, Boxing/Archery.</p> <p>The proposal has been approved for establishing SAI Training Centre with five Disciplines such as Athletics (Boys) Kabaddi (Boys), Football (Boys) and Hockey (Boys) while Athletics and Table Tennis (Girls).</p>
	<p>Attempts are being made by Dr. Rajini Kumar, faculty in charge to establish Paid Consultancy Services such UGC, NET and other competitive examinations Coaching Center at the University premises. An amount will be collected from the students where 50% of the revenue would be taken by the University and the rest 50% would be paid to the faculty members who handles the classes to the students.</p>
	<p>For the benefit of the students, a scheme on Learn and Earn has been proposed, where the students will be involved in supervising the infrastructure facilities. It has not yet initiated.</p>
	<p>Efforts are being made to have MoUs with leading Association of Tamil Nadu for the advantage of the students to have exposure in various sports and games.</p>
	<p>Proposals were sent with regard to various schemes through UGC namely:</p> <p>Massive Open Online Course – The university has registered under the portal for the conduct of MOOC. As the Expression of Interest is invited by the UGC in Non-Technology PG MOOC, proposal need to be sent in the social science subjects identified by UGC.</p>

i) The University has submitted a Proposal for **Financial Assistance for the Scheme of Remedial Coaching for SC/ST/OBC (Non Creamy Layer) and Minorities**. This scheme has been proposed with the following objectives:

- i. Improving academic skills and linguistic proficiency of the students in various subjects.
- ii. Raising their level of comprehension of basic subjects to provide a stronger foundation for further academic work.
- iii. Strengthening their knowledge, skills and attitudes in such subjects, where quantitative and qualitative techniques and laboratory activities are involved so that proper guidance and training provided under the program may enable the students to come up to the level necessary for pursuing higher studies efficiently.

Anticipating a favorable reply from the authorities.

ii) The University has submitted a Proposal for **Financial Assistance for the Scheme of NET / SET Coaching for SC/ST/OBC (Non Creamy Layer) and Minorities**. The main objective of the scheme is to prepare SC /ST candidates and candidates from Minority communities for appearing in NET or SET, so that sufficient number of candidates becomes available for selection of Lecturers in the University system from Anticipating a favorable reply from the authorities to implement the same.

Networking Resource System : A Proposal has been sent by Dr. Ashok Kumar, Asst. Librarian to the UGC for Digitalization of M.Phil and Ph.D theses – Inflibnet – Inter-University Centre, UGC. It was approved and implemented.

The Office of the Controllers' has also registered under National Academic Depository, where all the certificates of the students will be available in that portal.

National Skill Qualification Framework:

Dr. J. Anitha has been appointed as the nodal officer for the submission of the proposals for providing skill based education under National Skill Qualification Framework. Five Courses Viz. **Gym Instructor, Yoga Instructor, Sports Nutritionist, Event Management, Diabetes Educator.** These courses will be a great eye opener for such students who enter into the University after completing 10+2. The career based courses to be offered will greatly benefit the athletes who can become 'Job Givers' than being a 'Job Seeker'. Skills Gap requirements, to ensure that the program fulfils the skills requirement of industry. The aim of the skill development scheme is to create opportunities for the student of this university to take up sports / industry – relevant skill training that will help them in securing a better livelihood. The program was started but it did not continue in the later year.

Human Resource Development Center: Mr. K.B.Srinivasan, Sports Physiotherapist proposed to establish a center for conducting orientation and refresher courses for the teachers to acquire basic knowledge about fitness and healthy living, which they can infuse to students in near future. Efforts have been initiated for the same.

Dr. V. Murugavalavan adopted Swatch Bharath Abhiyan in the University in the form of initiating a cleaning drive of the campus.

Dr. V.S. Manaikandan faculty in charge has proposed to establish a **center for fostering Social Responsibility and Community Engagement** in University. Efforts have been initiated with the neighboring schools to make them aware about the importance of fitness in daily life.

	<p>Dr. R. Venkatesan faculty in charge will focus on the schemes for STRIDE (Trans-Disciplinary Research for India's Developing Economy) CARE. Efforts have been initiated.</p> <p>Dr. V. Ramesh Kumar faculty in charge will assist the faculty members for E-Content Development Project, Assistance under NME –ICT. Efforts have been initiated.</p> <p>Dr. Grace Helina, faculty in charge will focus on establish a center for Potential for Excellence in a particular area (CPEPA) to strengthen the academic and research facilities and infrastructure of the university. Efforts have been initiated.</p> <p>Dr. R. Ramakrishnan faculty in charge have motivated the faculty members to submit proposals on New Programs. The Department of Sports Management has started UG program in Sports Management.</p>
	<p>A committee on University Development Council has been constituted who would be looking after the development of the infrastructure of the University. This committee has a sub-committee named Master Plan Committee , who would be also in charge of the development. It is an attempt to regulate the growth and an instrument to work out and allocate land and infrastructure requirements of various uses of this University to result in harmonious and sustainable distribution of activities.</p> <p>Meetings were initiated but it did not continue further.</p>
